#### The Bishop of Norwich Opens New Group Room at Worstead Primary



In January the Bishop of Norwich officially opened a new Group Room at Worstead Primary, a St Benet's North school. Headteacher Nick Read tells us about the event:

"31 January heralded the official opening of our newly-built Group Room. In the course of its design we were also able to extend and rebuild Swifts classroom and both rooms now benefit from a modern wet area. I am very pleased to say that the new spaces are everything we could have wished for. The children of Worstead are already benefitting from the additional flexibility this allows our staff in their daily teaching. It's amazing how such a relatively small change to how a building is used can make such a difference."

"Our guests included representatives of the people involved with our school and this project in particular: our school governors,

parent volunteers, the Diocese of Norwich, the builders themselves, the Parish Council and a very honoured guest, Bishop Graham. The Bishop put on a special assembly for the children, demonstrating how to hook 'lost sheep' with his crozier, before cutting the ribbon on the Group Room and declaring it open."





Nick concludes, "But of course the most important people in all of this are our children, and with this project now finished, our children's education will remain at the highest standard in the years to come."

#### First Aid Training at Alburgh with Denton Primary

Alburgh with Denton Primary were pleased to have a First Aid training day for all of their pupils last week, which was generously funded by FADs (Friends of Alburgh and Denton).

#### iAM Compliant

Since Summer 2021 the Trust have been working with a new Management Information System which supports compliance across all our academy sites.

Business Managers and the premises team have worked hard to ensure that the relevant health and safety legislation is adhered to and also policies, procedures and training pertinent to individual sites have been uploaded. Staff members will now be receiving an invitation by their work email address to join iAMS if they have not already received it.

#### Coronation of King Charles III (6-8 May)

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#### **National Sequence of Events:**

**Saturday 6 May 2023**. The Coronation of His Majesty The King and Her Majesty The Queen Consort will take place at Westminster Abbey. The Service will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury. the Service will reflect the Monarch's role today and look towards the future, while being rooted in longstanding traditions and pageantry.

Across the Coronation Weekend, there will be further opportunities for people to come together in celebration of the historic occasion.

**Sunday 7 May 2023**. The Coronation Big Lunch is an initiative at which neighbours and communities are invited to share food and fun together. The Coronation Big Lunch will be overseen and organised by the Big Lunch team at the Eden Project.

**Sunday 7 May 2023**. A special Coronation Concert will be staged and broadcast live at Windsor Castle by the BBC and BBC Studios.

**Monday 8 May 2023**. The Big Help Out. The Big Help Out will encourage people to come out and support the causes that matter to them. Hundreds of activities are planned for the day by local community groups, organisations and charities including The Scouts, Royal Voluntary Service, National Trust and RNLI.

#### Writing Competition to Celebrate 650th Anniversary of Julian of Norwich

To celebrate the 650th anniversary of the first woman known to write a book in English, a special writing competition is being launched by the Friends of Julian of Norwich and the Eastern Daily Press (EDP) for children and young people aged between four and 18. Entrants are asked to submit prose or poetry up to a maximum of 500 words on the theme of "Divine Love".

The winner will receive £100 worth of book vouchers, the runner-up £50 worth of book vouchers, and any honourable mentions £30 worth of book vouchers.

There will also be other prizes from Norwich's independent bookshop *Bookbugs and Dragon Tales* and the National Centre for Writing – which will be announced in the EDP.

<u>Resignation Dates</u> - when a staff member resigns from the Trust please ensure that the leaving date is input in EduPay. This date should then pull through to BPS. However, if you input an end date in BPS it does not pull through to EduPay.

<u>Staff Lists</u> - please ensure that only staff who are currently employed reflect as "Employed". Staff who are no longer in our employ should reflect in "Left". To action this, a leaving date in the Employment Tab needs to be updated. Generate the P45 and post a copy to the employee.



<u>New Starters</u> - First add then in Edupay, and then in BPS please. When a new starter is added in EduPay, remember to send an email confirmation to ensure the staff member can log into their epayslips. This is actioned in the "Tools" tab.

#### Farewell to Laura Green as she retires from Tacolneston & Morley Federation

After nearly thirty years in teaching, Laura Green will retire from her role as Executive Headteacher of Tacolneston & Morley Federation this Easter.

Laura, who grew up in South London, spent the early part of her working life in law and property investment before training to teach at the University of Surrey in 1993.

"As a young person, I wanted to be an actor. I think teaching is the next best thing to acting. It allows you to interpret, create and deliver. Teaching gives you the opportunity to play a part in the growth and development of another person's life. It is a huge privilege to be able to engage and inspire children to learn and become the best that they can be," said Laura.



After her teacher training, she moved to Bedfordshire with her husband to join a Catholic primary school in Luton. The couple lived in Bedfordshire for 18 months, then her husband took a job with Norwich Union, as Aviva was known at the time, and moved to Norfolk where she worked in a wide range of schools including St Mary's Junior School, Cringleford Primary School and Heartsease Primary School.

Laura joined Tacolneston Church of England Primary School in 2014 on a short-term contract to fill the Y5/6 post when the previous post-holder had left part way through the year.

"At the time, I was considering leaving education to pursue a different career. However, I got sucked into this nurturing village school and chose to stay when the permanent role and the promotion to Assistant Headteacher was offered to me."



Mrs Green has many happy memories of teaching over the years. She said: "I have many happy memories of the people that I have worked with, and I have met some awe-inspiring individuals during the time that I have worked in Norfolk. These people have helped me to keep putting one foot in front of the other when times have been particularly challenging."

In her retirement she said she will be enjoying life with her family and her two dogs, Juno and Fig.

She said: "I intend to stay in my pyjamas, even on dog walks, for the first few months of retirement.

However, I'm not really taking full time retirement. I have been re-training over the past couple of years to become an integrative counsellor. I will complete four years of training next year and intend to work as a counsellor for the next part of my life. I will miss being part of these amazing teams of people. We have shared so many memories in the face of challenging times. I have laughed and cried with them. I'm sure that the friendships we've forged will be sustained for a long time to come."

Mrs Green said: "I am sad to be saying goodbye to my St Benet's Trust colleagues who took over the management of the schools last year. Despite only working with them for the past year, I have found their support, kindness and friendship an inspiration and a guiding force in helping me to lead my schools. I am leaving Tacolneston and Morley Primary Academies knowing that they are placed in very safe hands."

Richard Cranmer, CEO of St Benet's Trust, said: "In the relatively short time that Tacolneston and Morley schools have been working with St Benet's, we have benefitted enormously from Laura's wealth of skills, experience and professionalism. She has a very well-formed vision for what makes a successful Church School experience for children and has clearly got the drive to deliver this. We thank Laura for all that she has done for the thousands of children she will have come into contact with over her career and wish her every success in the next chapter of her life."
