Safeguarding

- Never think you have done enough in creating a safer culture
- Always believe it could happen here
- Keep safeguarding high on everyone's agenda
- Never rely on one process to keep children safe

This week's communication will be via a YouTube video <u>here</u> with end of term updates for you all. Information on the KCSIE 2023 and a reflection on lessons learn this term from working across the schools. This is relevant to watch now and also at the start of term.

Policies

The Safeguarding Policy will be with you by next Wednesday. The video above states by September but it will be with you next week so you can add your details ready for the start of term.

The whole school Local Authority safeguarding training for the start of term is now ready on My School.

Other reminders:

As we move towards the end of term, there are several actions that you will need to consider:

- ⇒ Have you completed a check on your SCR this term? Have you recorded the actions and the SCR check? Your safeguarding governor may wish to carry out this check, if they feel suitably equipped to do so. However, remember it is not a directive that they do this. Their responsibility is to check that you are checking!
- ⇒ For your vulnerable students that are transferring out or into your school, have suitable arrangements been made? For example, have you had a conversation with the DSL at the transferring school so they are ready prepared to support the child transferring to them?
- ⇒ What summer holiday support plans are in place, for example, have you notified parents of nearest foodbanks etc that they can access? Have you notified parents of the Big Norfolk Holiday Fun scheme that has free spaces for those on means tested free school meals? <u>https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/what-we-do-and-how-we-work/campaigns/big-norfolk-holiday-fun</u>
