New CEO Appointed at DoNESC



The Diocesan services company, DoNESC, will be welcoming their new permanent CEO, Stephen Beeson, into his role on Monday October 2nd.

Stephen brings a wealth of experience from a successful career working in senior finance, procurement, and operation roles.

His early career was spent in the FE college sector and local government. He then moved into the Academy sector, working for Drapers' Multi Academy Trust in Romford for seven years, ultimately

as Chief Operating Officer.

Most recently he has worked for NHS Hospital Trusts, with his current role being Deputy Director of Finance at the Norfolk and Norwich Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. Applications for the Learn about Livestock project are now open!

This unique project gives students the chance to experience farming first hand by caring for a ewe and her lamb(s) on school grounds for an entire week.

The Food and Farming Discovery Trust delivers all equipment needed to look after the ewe and lamb(s) including food. Schools involved in the scheme will be given full support regarding risk assessments, 24-hour telephone support and expert veterinary assistance. A compulsory briefing session is also provided prior to the event, to enable you to ask questions and familiarise yourself with the staff and the animals.





Places **are limited** and the application deadline is **Friday 10th November 2023**. Schools are required to have a small, grassed area upon which a 10ft x 15ft pen for the animals can be accommodated and participating schools will be asked to provide a £250 contribution.

Help Desk - Procedures for Finance Processing and Management Accounts

Thank you all so much for using the new Help Desk this week.

Following on from feedback received, please note the slight changes in processes with regards to the Finance Department.

Please continue to log all gueries and guestions on the Helpdesk.

However, please note that the following information will need to be sent directly to the relevant Finance team, to avoid unnecessary uploading and downloading of files.



Management Accountants - please forward items to your MA that do not need a response, or are part of a process that needs to be continued with another department (such as recruitment requests). Also, if your MA comes to you to request information, please reply to that directly, not through the Help Desk.

Finance Processing - please forward invoices, financial statements etc to the Finance inbox (<u>finance@donesc.org</u>) as before. Use the Help Desk for requests for information and queries.

A polite reminder - if queries are sent to DoNESC team members directly you will be asked to raise these on the Help Desk instead.

It is likely that further tweaks and improvements will be made to the Help Desk as we move forward, and you will be kept posted on these as and when they happen.

DSL Network Meeting

Bystander Intervention Programme

The Local Authority is currently running a free training programme to tackle sexual language in schools. I attended the training and highly recommend that schools attend. You would need to send a member of staff for the day training, staff in school complete a survey online, then this person would train the staff in the school which could be done as part of a twilight session - potentially 1.5 hours, could be split over two. Then there are two lessons which are all good to go and would be incorporated as part of PSHEE.

It trains children and staff to address and call out sexualised language and how to do so.

There are two dates that are available for training at County Hall (22nd Nov and 12th Dec - bookable on the usual LA training pages) but the trainer has said she would run another session and would travel to a venue of ours too. If you are interested but are not able to get to those two dates then email me at louise.veeren@donesc.org and I will then organise something for the Trust if there is enough interest.

The impact of this is society wide....this is also great evidence to show how we are tackling this huge issue within our schools.

HSB Training
