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Alburgh with Denton Primary Supports Waveney Foodbank

Each term, Alburgh with Denton Primary Academy supports a chosen charity. This term they decided to extend the collections received at their Harvest Festival Service and continue collecting for the Waveney Foodbank.

The school council representatives travelled to the Eye depot on Monday 13th November to drop off an additional 32kg of food, which equals 40 meals. The children had a tour of the foodbank and learned all about the process of receiving donations, sorting and packing.

They discovered it wasn't just food that was collected but also cleaning equipment, toiletries and animal food. They were astounded to hear that in recent years the foodbank has gone from supporting approximately 1,000 people to around 12,000 people every year.
