#### **Updated Admissions Policies**

S07 Admissions Policies have recently been approved by the Executive Team. Editable versions have been sent to academy Heads and offices and are now available on the Resources Hub on the Trust website.

Please ensure that the relevant policy is personalised for your academy, uploaded to the Academy website (where required), and noted at the next LGC meeting. Please also ensure that all staff are given a copy/made aware of the updated policies.

#### Data Breach Reminder

Please can we remind everyone to be vigilant about ensuring that inappropriate data is not accidentally shared via the use of interactive whiteboards in classrooms that are connected to teacher's laptops. Colleagues may be carrying out several areas of work on one device leading to a risk that pupil data is accidentally shown on screen.

Best practice would recommend that the information to be shared with the class is the only application open during teaching time, or, if that is not possible, that your display is extended to the whiteboard/screen and not duplicated. In a recent example, an email containing potentially sensitive pupil data was briefly displayed to a class. In that case the risk to the pupil was low, however we know that we may be communicating sensitive information about pupils that we really don't want to share with their classmates or even other members of staff.

To get into the habit of being mindful and careful is to engage in data protection by design and default - the GDPR gold standard.

We can challenge services if we feel our cases are stuck or not getting through.

Contact Louise to organise a case review to look at what we are doing, what more can be done and support with challenging services for further support. Remember, we see the children in our care every day and if it isn't right then we need to challenge services to support.

#### **Safer Recruitment**

- The letter from the Diocese regarding those approved by the Bishop is awaiting approval from the Bishop before being available and this is expected shortly. Remember, this will only apply to those approved directly and not spouses of clergy or other volunteers. We will need to follow our own volunteer processes for this.
- It has come to light that Step Teachers do not have listed that they do overseas checks on their assurances that accompany the profiles of those who are working for them. This has been checked and they do this and it is in their policy but not on their website. If you are using Step Teachers ask them for their policy on this which you can put together with their other documentation. If we ask maybe they will change their assurance information.
- Aspens letter of assurance also does not state that they do overseas checks. They have said that they will amend the letter and resend as they do complete these checks. When this is available Louise will make this available to schools via IAMCompliant.

If you are shortlisting staff and wish HR to complete the online checks for you they will do this. Contact them via the Helpdesk.

#### **Prevent Risk Assessment**

This has not been forgotten - it will be available next week. Final checks are being completed by Louise.
