St Benet's Chaplaincy Project Brings Dancers Into Schools



As part of the St Benet's Multi Academy Trust Chaplaincy Project (South), we were delighted to be able to arrange a visit to eight of the schools (either within the Trust or due to join) from a professional dance company called 'Springs'.

Their interactive show of 'Parable', based mostly on 'The Good Samaritan' was extremely well-received by both pupils and staff. A member of the chaplaincy team was able to accompany the dancers to most of the performances, thereby giving the opportunity for follow-up in the schools. The interactive performance encouraged children to take part in the dance, culminating in pupils helping to put together their own version of 'The Good Samaritan' in dance form at the end of the show. Throughout the workshop performance, there were opportunities for pupils to win points for their teams through quizzes, dance ideas and thoughtful responses as to how the parable might apply to their lives. Staff commented on how well the pupils engaged throughout the performance, even those who were a bit dubious about a dance workshop beforehand!

We loved hearing the gasps of wonder as the children watched the dance sections - especially the lifts! For many of the children, this was likely to have been their first experience of seeing live professional dancers, especially up so close, so this was a truly special experience for them.

We would like to thank the Growing Faith Foundation, and the Norwich Diocese for subsidising the performances to make this tour possible.

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
Prayer for the Day

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Operational Updates from DoNESC

DoNESC (Diocese of Norwich Education Services Company) provide St Benet's with back office services including HR, Finance, Payroll, Governance and Estates.

Update from Estates Team on Energy Provider

We are pleased to announce that we will be moving to West Mercia Energy for the fully managed service of our energy supplies.

As part of the transfer from Indigo Swan to West Mercia Energy we need to provide meter readings for all electricity and gas meters.



West Mercia have been provided with the contact details of all academies, so please could we ask you to send your meter readings when you are contacted to do so.

If your site has more than one electricity or gas meter, please could we ask you to identify which meter each reading is taken from by adding the MPR number (Gas) or MPAN top line number (Electricity).

The move to the new supplier will take place once they all the meter information.

Data Protection Update

Data Protection by Design and Default - integrating robust privacy practices to ensure that personal data is protected from the outset and throughout its lifecycle.

Law Enforcement Requests for Pupil Information

There may be times when the Police ask a school for information related to pupils to support a legal process. This is often requested with some urgency, however our duty to provide the information is underpinned by the strong principles of the UKGDPR. Therefore, on receipt of such a request schools must:

- 1. **Insist** that the request is made on the Police force's DP9 (consent form signed by the data subject agreeing to the release of their records to the Police) form.
- 2. **Insist** that the form is signed off by someone ranked at Inspector or above.
- 3. **Insist** that the form is copied to the Trust Data Protection Officer at the time of the request by the Police.

If there are difficulties with any of the above, then the request must be referred to the Police force's Data Protection Officer.

Pupil Exclusion Panel Packs

Please can all schools be reminded that all pupil exclusion packs must be checked and redacted before they are sent to the panel. Contact details for parents, names of other children and any other PII (Personal Identifying Information) not related to the pupil being excluded must be redacted. 

CPOMS

When a child transfers out of your school and to another CPOMS school, ensure that you have checked the 'manage categories' tab and have clicked all the categories so all the records transfer.
