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Dickleburgh Primary Pupils Explore Science at Norwich Cathedral

Year 4 and Year 5 from Dickleburgh CofE Primary Academy took part in Norwich Cathedral's Sacred Science morning last week, part of the Norwich Science Festival 2025.

They learned about how science was used in the design of the building and that when the Cathedral was built 900 years ago there was no electric light and that candles and windows were the only source of light.

They learned that the stained-glass windows are translucent, depicting stories from the Bible and how the colours are produced by the glass absorbing light.

They used a compass to work out where the sunlight was coming from in the crossing and learned that when the Normans built the Cathedral, they used arches everywhere because the arch shape distributes the forces along the arch and down the pillars; lying on their backs they studied the amazing vaulted ceiling. Did you know that when the Cathedral caught fire hundreds of years ago, the limestone turned pink and you can still see that today? These are just some of the amazing science facts they discovered during their visit.

The children's behaviour was exemplary and was commented on by the members of the public who were visiting the Cathedral at the same time.

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
