We meet every two weeks. The YCs have the opportunity to report any good or challenging things that they have done and they support each other with solutions and praise. Then we move onto the FUN part of our session! We have a vast range of activities....

...edible slime, parachute games, Easter nests, Mother's (important carer) cards/flowers, games fest, Christmas craft, clay, various cooking (sweet treats, summer picnic), den building, treasure hunt, marbling, painting Welcome stones, planting bulbs/flowers, Chinese feast (Chinese New Year), Pancake Day, Malteser blow football and much, much more. We help each other, make a mess, make a noise and have fun.

To achieve the 'Carer Friendly Tick Award' Tacolneston Primary Academy had to:

- Choose a member of staff as Champion/Lead for Young Carers Group
- Develop a Young Carers Agreement in consultation with the children
- Cover issues relating to being a Young Carer in staff training (thanks to Nadine Avenal, Trust Improvement Lead for SEND for our staff training)
- Display information about Young Carers and the support they can get
- Raise awareness of Young Carers with displays, assemblies, PSHE lessons

One Young Carer comments, "I enjoy the YC group, being together, socialising with each other, working as a team with other children that are YCs. We always have fun."

Another Young Carer says, "We get to do lots of fun things, everyone comes together and it's good to spend time with other YCs."

Printers


