News from DoNESC

Reminder - Pupil Christmas Cards and GDPR

A reminder that the school cannot provide a list of names (including first names) to parents for Christmas cards without parental consent for each child included. Giving out a class list is disclosing personal data. The task is not essential to the running of the school and so parental consent is required for this.

The GDPR does not apply to individuals, only organisations, so there is nothing to stop a pupil or a parent jotting down the names of everyone in the class, but the school as an organisation cannot provide a list without informed consent from every parent.

Rollout of Juniper MIS across St Benet's

As the two Juniper Sonar training sessions have now taken place, we are moving our focus to the rollout of the MIS software across the Trust's schools.

Rosemary Ison (DoNESC Operations Manager) and Juniper are preparing a phased rollout implementation plan for the MIS software. This will involve in-person and online training sessions for admin staff members which will be scheduled a number of weeks ahead of your school's actual rollout date.

The MIS rollout programme started in October with Tallocneston & Morley Primaries and our remaining schools will follow on a phased basis after the January census.

Pupil Asset will continue to run alongside Juniper for a period of time as the new system beds in.
